Call for Classes

Phoenix Center for the Arts seeking art class and workshop proposals Deadline: February 26, 2021

PHOENIX, AZ – (February 12, 2021) Phoenix Center for the Arts is seeking proposals from teaching artists for innovative, short-duration creative classes and workshops in a variety of mediums. The call is for classes of any duration and frequency, with a focus on one or two-day classes and workshops, lasting approximately two to three hours. Proposals can be submitted on the Teaching Artist Opportunities page at phoenixcenterforthearts.org.

The Center is accepting proposals for classes from artists of all mediums, and presentation formats including: online, in-studio or outside at the Center, and on location offerings.

Specific class calls include but are not limited to:

- Culinary Arts (Online)
- Digital Content (music, video, animation, graphic design, etc)
- Multi-disciplinary Classes (i.e. writing+painting or improv+drawing)
- On-location Outdoor Workshops (sketch in the park, city photography)
- Hybrid Outdoor/Digital (from photo to studio or from sketchbook to studio)
- Intro to Specific Materials (ex. watercolor pencils, pastels, collage, sketchbooks, etc.)

- Deadline for submissions: Friday, February 26, 2021 by 5 p.m. (MST)

Health & Safety

In order to provide a safe creative space for students, Phoenix Center for the Arts is continuing health and safety protocols, originally implemented during the fall 2020 sessions, for all in-person programming. Protocols taken by PCA to create a safe and welcoming environment include, but are not limited to:

- Smaller class sizes to allow for 6-feet of social distance between students
- Limiting classrooms to hosting 2 classes per day
- 2-hour cleaning periods between each class
- Staggered class start times to reduce contact
- Mask requirements for staff, teaching artists, and students
- Outdoor check-in tables
- Multiple hand sanitizing stations throughout the facility
