Health & Safety

In order to provide a safe creative space for students, Phoenix Center for the Arts is continuing their health and safety protocols, originally implemented during the fall 2020 sessions. Protocols taken by PCA to create a safe and welcoming environment include, but are not limited to:

- Smaller class sizes to allow for 6-feet of social distance between students
- Limiting classrooms to hosting 2 classes per day
- 2-hour cleaning periods between each class
- Staggered class start times to reduce contact
- Mask requirements for staff, teaching artists, and students
- Outdoor check-in tables
- Multiple hand sanitizing stations throughout the facility
